YAWKEY SCHOLARS PROGRAM HISTORY

The Yawkey Foundation is dedicated to perpetuating the philanthropic legacy of Tom Yawkey and Jean Yawkey, whose eight decades of quiet generosity supported individuals and families in the communities that were closest to their hearts – Massachusetts and Georgetown County, South Carolina. Having awarded more than \$500 million to-date in charitable grants to organizations focused on Health Care, Education, Human Services, Youth and Amateur Athletics, Arts and Culture, and Conservation and Wildlife, Yawkey Foundation is committed to preserving and sustaining the charitable values of the Yawkeys by investing in impactful nonprofits providing resources, opportunity, and dignity to the vulnerable and underserved.

In 2005, the Yawkey Foundations established the Yawkey Scholars Program. This program is designed to make college affordable for talented, motivated, low-income, first-generation students from Georgetown, South Carolina. It provides a four-year renewable tuition scholarship and other supports to help students achieve academically and go on to be successful and highly productive members of our community. This scholarship seeks to support students who have a significant gap (of at least \$10,000 or more) in what it costs to attend college and the financial aid and scholarships the student receives. Since 2005, the Yawkey Scholars Program has provided more than \$15 million in scholarship support to over 375 Scholars as they pursue a college education.

THE AWARD:

- Four-year, renewable scholarship to cover tuition, fees, and educational expenses.
 - Award amounts vary based on student unmet need.
 - Eligibility and scholarship amounts will be determined in consultation with the college the student chooses to attend and the financial aid package a student receives from the college. The goal of this scholarship is to fill significant gap in the student's unmet financial need and enable a student to attend the college of their choosing and graduate with a manageable loan burden.
- Yawkey Advisor for each student to provide support throughout their four years of college.
- Opportunities Fund supplemental financial support to allow Scholars to participate in enriching activities and meet their academic goals.
- Resources and network to help Scholars achieve their full potential.

Community Involvement	Involved in a balance of community, school, and work activities.
	• Exhibit leadership potential and a desire to make a meaningful contribution to our community.
Other	• First generation college student. A first-generation college student is defined as a student whose parent(s) have not completed a 4-year bachelor's degree.

Complete applications are due **Wednesday, March 1, 2023 by noon EST**. Please follow instructions carefully. Applicants' ability to follow instruction will weigh into award decisions.

The following materials are required. Only complete applications submitted online will be considered.

- 1. Complete Application Submitted Online
- 2. Essay
- 3. High School Transcript
- 4. Teacher/Guidance Counselor Recommendation (including test and transcript information from school official)
- 5. Mentor Letter of Recommendation (to be written out by a work supervisor, community leader, coach, teacher or any other non-family member who knows you well)
- 6. Financial Aid Award Letter (if available)
- 7. Pages 1 and 2 of parent(s)' most recent IRS 1040 Tax Forms
- Complete Student Aid Report (SAR) from FAFSA. This document will be approximately five pages long. You must submit the <u>ENTIRE</u> document.

TIMELINE

- Selected applicants will be invited for interviews in April.
- Scholarship recipients and amounts will be announced in late April/early May.
