Scholarship Description

The Harrison Scholarship is a scholarship that aims to make college affordable to students who receive Catholic Schools Foundation (CSF) scholarship support. This scholarship program is interested in making college affordable for these families and helping students reach their full potential. Selected applicants are provided four-year, renewable scholarships to cover tuition, fees and educational expenses at a competitive four year college/university in the U.S. and flexible funding to support student's enrichment costs. Scholarship amounts will be determined based on the financial aid award package the student receives from the college they choose to attend. Scholarships will likely range from \$5,000 to \$15,000 per year. The program is funded by an anonymous donor and administered by The Philanthropic Initiative (TPI).

Requirements

Qualifications: Applicants must

- 1. be a senior or recent high school graduate who is currently receiving/received Catholic Schools Foundation (CSF) scholarship support.
- 2. be enrolling as a first-year student in a competitive four-year degree program, at a US accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university full-time in 2024-2025.
- 3. have an Adjusted Gross Family Income (AGI) of \$100,000 or less and an unmet financial need of \$5,000 or more, after subtracting all other financial aid offered from the college/university.
- 4. have a strong high school academic record; involvement in community, school and work activities; and motivation to excel in college.

Completing your application

- To preview the application, click on the **Print Questions** button in the upper right-hand corner. You should do this prior to beginning the application to review the questions.
- Click the **Save as Draft** button at the bottom of the page to save your responses. To return to your application on a later date, log in and click on your application under your contact information. It will be marked Draft until you submit it.
- Questions marked with an asterisk (*) are required. You will not be able to submit your application until all required questions are answered.
- If you would like to save a copy of this application, click on **Application Packet** button at the top of the page.
- Recommender must upload a letter of recommendation to the student's online application.

Submitting your application:

- All attachments must be submitted in .pdf, .doc, or .docx format.
- You must submit your application for it to be considered. Once you submit your
 application, you will receive an email confirming its receipt. If you do not receive this
 email, then it has not been properly submitted and will not be reviewed. Log back into
 your account to submit, or email harrison@tpi.org.
- To request a recommendation, enter the email address of your reference in the space provided, then click "Compose Email" to send them an email requesting a reference.
 They will receive an email from the system which will include a link for them to click on and answer questions.

• Your recommenders will continue to have access to submit their materials even after you click "submit." You do not need to wait for your recommendations to be complete in order to submit your application.

Important: Review your application before clicking "submit". Make sure all attachments are uploaded in .pdf, .doc, or .docx format, and your answers are complete and clear. Click on the "Application Packet" button to view your application in the form the reviewers will see it.

Applications that have blank, unreadable attachments, or don't load correctly will not be considered. Please note that .jpeg files are not able to be viewed. It is important that you look over your application to make sure everything has been properly submitted.
