Scholarship Description

The Ann Theodore Foundation Scholarship Program opens the door to post-secondary education opportunities for youth and adults. This program is designed to help residents from Roosevelt and North Babylon in New York and Manchester, New Hampshire attend and graduate from post-secondary institutions, including two-year schools, trade schools, and four-year colleges. The program serves low-income high school seniors and adults who have a desire to attain a college degree. If accepted into the program, students receive scholarships of up to \$20,000 annually, for up to four years, plus mentoring and funding for enrichment opportunities. The program is administered by The Philanthropic Initiative (TPI).

Applications must be submitted online by either the early deadline of Monday April 1, 2024 or the regular deadline of Wednesday May 1, 2024 by 5:00 pm. Students who submit before the early deadline may receive a decision in late April. Students will only receive an early decision if all necessary information and materials are provided in a timely manner. Students who submit early will either be awarded, deferred to the regular applicant pool, or will not be awarded. Students can only submit one application per year. Students who submit an application by the regular deadline will receive a decision before the end of June.

Application Criteria

Applicant Criteria

- High school senior or adult resident from Roosevelt (NY), North Babylon (NY), or Manchester (NH), or graduate of a high school of one of these three towns, applying to attend or currently attending a two-year school, trade school, or four-year college (parttime or full-time) in the upcoming school year. Preference is given to students who are entering their first or second year of school.
- Priority will be given to applicants with a Student Aid Index (SAI) of \$12,000 or lower or with a family Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) of under \$125,000. The SAI can be found on the FAFSA Submission Summary, or the AGI can be found on the applicant's family's most recent 1040 tax form.

- Substantial unmet need of at least \$10,000 beyond what is being offered in college financial aid and other scholarships, as determined by college financial aid award letter and after considering the student's SAI.
- Applicants must be US Citizens, US Permanent Residents (aka Green Card holders), or DACA or TPS recipients.
- The program aims to support students who are choosing an affordable college option.
- Applicants must be able to clearly articulate how this scholarship will impact their life and goals and have a drive to meet these goals through further education.
- Applicants must exhibit good citizenship and a commitment to building and investing in their community.

Instructions for Completing the Application

Completing your application

- To preview the application, click on the **Print Questions** button in the upper right-hand corner.
- Click the **Save as Draft** button at the bottom of the page to save your responses. To return to your application at a later date, log in and click on your application under your contact information. It will be marked Draft until you submit it.
- Questions marked with an asterisk (*) are required. You will not be able to submit your application until all required questions are answered.

Submitting your application:

• You must submit your application for it to be considered. Applications in draft are not reviewed. Once you submit your application, you will receive an email confirming its receipt. If you do not receive this email, then it has not been properly submitted and will not be reviewed. Log back into your account to submit your application.

Before Clicking Submit: Make sure all attachments are uploaded in .pdf, .doc, or .docx format, and your answers are complete and clear. Click on the "Application Packet" button to view your application in the form the reviewers will see it. Applications that have blank, unreadable attachments, or don't load correctly will not be considered. It is important that you look over your application to make sure everything has been properly submitted.
