Scholarship Description

ABOUT

Barowsky Scholars is a scholarship that seeks to support students who are interested in honing their careful listening, civic discourse, facilitation and negotiation skills to become leaders that build trust and find common ground across people and groups with differing views and experiences. Maine residents, who are graduating from high school and planning to attend a four-year college to obtain their bachelor's degree are eligible to apply.

The program is funded by Andrew P. Barowsky Charitable Foundation and administered by The Philanthropic Initiative (TPI).

THE AWARD

- Four-year, renewable scholarship to cover tuition, fees and educational expenses at a four-year college/university in the US.
- Merit-based scholarship for open-minded students who are motivated to excel in college and are committed to bridging divides to work towards building a better society.
- Scholarship amounts will be determined in-part based on the financial aid award package the student receives from the college they choose to attend. Scholarship amounts will range from \$5,000 to \$25,000 per year.

Requirements

ELIGIBILITY

- U.S. citizen and current resident of Maine.
- High school senior or recent high school graduate.
- Enrolling as a first-year student in a four-year degree program, at an accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university in the U.S. full-time in 2025-2026.
- Strong academic record in high school.
- Motivated to excel in college and make a difference in their community, and in society overall.

- Must complete one economics course and two of any of the following courses prior to completing college: accounting, finance, history or psychology.
- Student demonstrates a commitment to reasoned, rational thinking, an ability to collaborate and work across difference, and a desire to deploy those skills in furtherance of civic engagement.
- Involved in a balance of community, school, and work activities.
- Students must live on campus in housing paid directly to the university (e.g. in university sponsored housing or student-group organized housing) and attend classes in-person to receive and renew the scholarship.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

The following materials are required. Only complete applications submitted online will be considered.

- Application Submitted Online
- Extracurricular Information or Resume
- Letter of Recommendation (from a teacher, guidance counselor, work supervisor, community leader, coach, or any other non-family member who knows the student well)
- An essay that reflects the student's personal experiences and approach to finding common ground by responding to a specific four-part essay prompt.
- High School Transcript
- Financial Aid Award letter from the college/university the student plans to attend
- FAFSA Submission Summary. The ENTIRE document must be submitted. If the student has not applied for federal financial aid, please indicate this in the application.

Completing your application:

- You can save your application and return to it later by clicking "save" and logging out. Your application will be marked *Draft* and you can return to it at any time by logging back into your account.
- Questions marked with an asterisk (*) are required. You will not be able to submit your application until all required questions are answered.
- If you would like to save your application, please click the **Save as Draft** button at the bottom of the page. If you would like to return to your application on a later date, you may do so by logging in and clicking on your application under your contact information. It will be marked *Draft* until you submit it.

Submitting your application:

- All attachments must be submitted in **.pdf, .doc, or .docx** format.
- You must submit your application for it to be considered. Once you submit your application, you will receive an email confirming its receipt.
- If you do not receive a confirmation email, then you have not properly submitted your application, and it will not be reviewed. If you do not receive this email, log back into your account to submit your application, or email **barowskyscholars@tpi.org** for assistance.
- To request a recommendation, enter the email address of your reference in the space provided, then click "Compose Email" to send them an email requesting a reference. They will receive an email from this system which will include a link for them to click on and answer questions. Your recommender will be able to upload their materials to your application even after you submit your application. You do not need to wait for your recommendation to be complete in order to submit your application.

Important: be sure to review your application before clicking "submit" to make sure that all attachments have been uploaded correctly and your answers are clear. To do this, click on the "Application Packet" button in the top right-hand corner of the page. This will allow you to view your application in the form the reviewers will see it. ***Applications that have unreadable attachments or don't load correctly will not be considered. It is very important that you look over your application to make sure that everything will be properly submitted.***

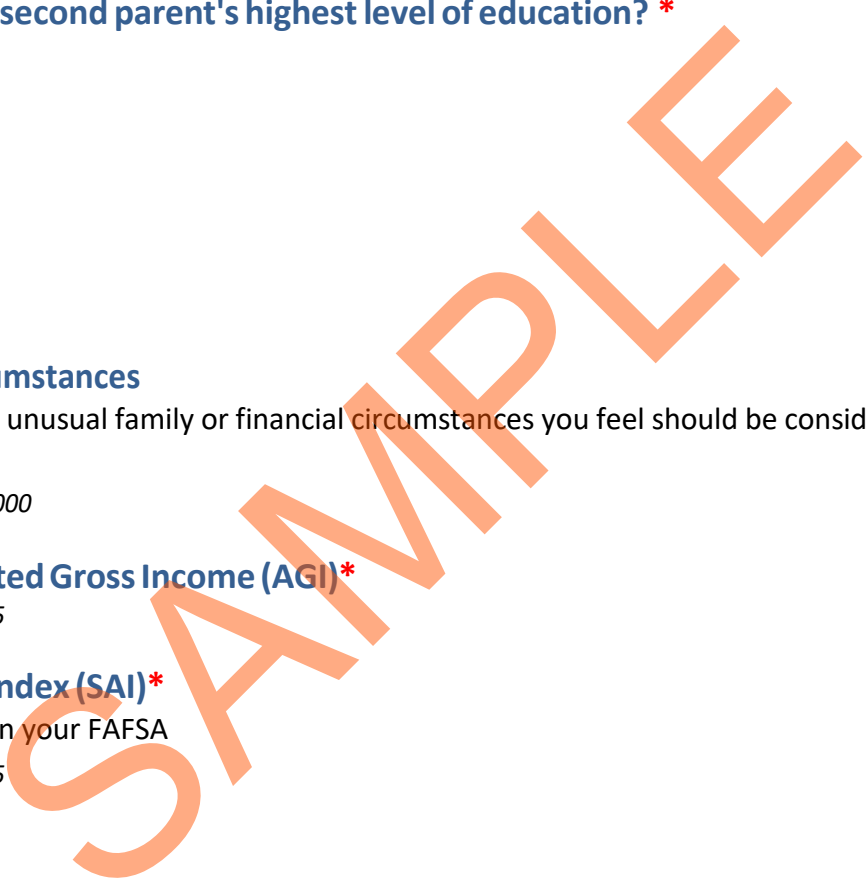

Bridgebuilding can be defined as people of diverse identities, ideologies, and lived experiences coming together to take shared action for the common good.

** This essay should reflect your personal experience and viewpoints. Please write a four part essay that responds to all questions in each section below. Your full response should be within the 500-word limit. **

A. Think about the issues people in your family, school, town, country or world are divided over and select one to write about. Please reflect on these issues and your experience talking and/or collaborating with someone who has a different perspective on the issue than you. How did you manage the different perspectives? What strategies did you use to ensure the conversation remained civil? What steps did you take to move forward, work together, and make progress in solving the problem.

B. Based on your own experience, what makes people unable, unwilling, or too scared to share their opinions and ideas about the world we live in? What has your own experience been discussing or choosing not to discuss divisive issues? What issues have you discussed, in what setting, and how did it go? What would you do differently next time? If you have shied away from these discussions, what would help you to be able to discuss important topics?

C. Why is it important to actively seek out and listen to viewpoints different than your own? What issues or problems can be improved by working together with people who have had different life experiences and who hold a variety of beliefs, perspectives, opinions, viewpoints, and identities?

D. While in college, what skills will you look to develop to be more effective in bridging divides? What courses or extra curriculars do you plan to seek out in college to gain knowledge, engage in thoughtful discussions about issues that divide our communities, cities, states, or country? How will you attempt to bridge divides to solve problems and reach shared goals?
