

The Arisdine Krikorian Scholarship 2025-2026

Scholarship Description

The Krikorian family was deeply proud of their Armenian heritage and devoted to many Armenian organizations in Watertown and Belmont, Massachusetts. They were keenly interested in the educational advancement of Armenian children. That interest led to the creation of this scholarship program.

Arisdine and Panos Krikorian were born and raised in Armenia. They emigrated to the United States, settled in Watertown and later moved to Belmont where they lived for many years. They had three children Harold, Rose and Sybil. Rose, the last survivor of the Krikorian family, died in 2021 at the age of 96. Following Rose's death, this scholarship was created to have an impact on the Armenian community that was so important to the Krikorian family.

Requirements

Qualifications: Applicants must

1. must either be a high school senior, undergraduate or graduate students who are either:
 - of Armenian descent
 - OR**
 - pursuing Armenian studies at the college/university level
2. be a U.S. citizen or non-citizen eligible to apply for FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) **AND** a permanent resident of Massachusetts.
3. enrolling as a full-time student in a four-year undergraduate college/university or graduate degree program of any length in 2025-26. The college/university must be a U.S. accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university.
4. financial need will be taken into consideration in determining who receives the scholarship and its amount.
5. have a strong high school academic record with a GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale (or its equivalent); involvement in community, school and work activities; and motivation to excel in college.

 - **Letter of Recommendation** (from a teacher, guidance counselor, work supervisor, community leader, coach, or any other non-family member who knows the student well)
 - **Two Essays**
 - An essay responding to the following prompt:
 - Please describe your academic and career ambitions and how receiving this scholarship would help you achieve your goals.
- AND**
- An essay responding to **ONE** of the following prompts:
 - Explain how your Armenian heritage has influenced your personal development and your choice of educational and community activities.
 - Explain your interest in majoring in Armenian studies and what you hope to do after completing your degree.
 - **High School Transcript** (for students applying to colleges or universities as first year students)
 - **Current College or Post-Graduate School Transcript** (for students in college or already enrolled in a post-graduate program)
 - **FAFSA Submission Summary** – the full document should be submitted.

Instructions

Completing your application

- To preview the application, click on the **Print Questions** button in the upper right-hand corner. You should do this prior to beginning the application to review the questions.
- Click the **Save as Draft** button at the bottom of the page to save your responses. To return to your application on a later date, log in and click on your application under your contact information. It will be marked Draft until you submit it.
- Questions marked with an asterisk (*) are required. You will not be able to submit your application until all required questions are answered.
- If you would like to save a copy of this application, click on **Application Packet** button at the top of the page.
- Recommender must upload a letter of recommendation to the student's online application.

Submitting your application:

- All attachments must be submitted in **.pdf, .doc, or .docx** format.
- You must submit your application for it to be considered. Once you submit your application, you will receive an email confirming its receipt. If you do not receive this email, then it has not been properly submitted and will not be reviewed. Log back into your account to submit, or email krikorian@tpi.org
- To request a recommendation, enter the email address of your reference in the space provided, then click "Compose Email" to send them an email requesting a reference. They will receive an email from the system which will include a link for them to click on and answer questions.
- Your recommenders will continue to have access to submit their materials even after you click "submit." You do not need to wait for your recommendations to be complete in order to submit your application.

Important: Review your application before clicking "submit". Make sure all attachments are uploaded in **.pdf, .doc, or .docx** format, and your answers are complete and clear. Click on the "Application Packet" button to view your application in the form the reviewers will see it.

Applications that have blank, unreadable attachments, or don't load correctly will not be considered. Please note that .jpeg files are not able to be viewed. It is important that you look over your application to make sure everything has been properly submitted.
